Important notes for J-PAC

- 1.Students who have not started studying Japanese at the time of application cannot apply. Please check whether the applicant has started learning Japanese.
- 2.As the number of applicants to J-PAC has increased rapidly in recent years, we will consider whether the student exchange is a mutual exchange and the number of students we receive and send out is being balanced when making selections.
- 3.If there have been no students from Chiba University who have studied abroad at your university either physically or online in the past five years (starting from 2021), we may ask you to adjust the number of students acceptance.
- 4.Students may not be able to take all course for which students wish to receive credit transfer.
- 5.Please strictly adhere to the nomination and application deadline.

4. Cost and Insurance	
Accommodation	Off-campus housing will be secured for exchange students from partner universities. https://www.chiba-u.ac.jp/international/isd/en/housing/index.html
Living costs	It costs around 100,000 yen per month for meals, electricity, phone bills and dormitory. Students will also need to pay for textbooks, leisure and other activities. It may be different depending on individual's lifestyle.
Insurance	1. National Health Insurance (about 20,000 yen/year) 2. Personal Accident Insurance for Students Pursuing Education and Research "Gakkensai" (1,000 yen/year) 3. Comprehensive Insurance for Students Lives Couples with Gakkensai "Inbound Futai-Gakusou" (1,860 yen/year) are compulsory. The amount is subject to change.
