#### 1. Profile of Yamagata University

Yamagata University has six departments with twelve majors and seven post-graduate courses. It has four campuses <sup>1</sup>. The total number of students on all four campuses is about 9,000. As one of the leading universities in the Tōhoku (northern Japan) area, it fulfills an important role in both study and research. The number of students at Yonezawa campus, which is home to the Faculty of Engineering, Graduate School of Science and Engineering, and Graduate School of Organic Materials Science (hereinafter collectively referred to as "Faculty of Engineering"), is about 3,600. With 'symbiosis between nature and mankind' as its theme, Yamagata University is very active in developing human resources that will play a major role in the next generation. Yamagata University aims to pursue and develop knowledge and work towards the prosperity of the local communities.

As of May 1, 2020, approximately 95 students from 14 countries are studying at the Faculty of Engineering. We have interfaculty exchange agreements with 26 universities in 12 countries, offering international educational experience for both students and faculty members.

#### 2. Profile of STEP-YUFE

Yamagata University Faculty of Engineering offers a short-term program for international students, giving students from universities with exchange agreements the opportunity to study here while being enrolled in their home universities. This program is called STEP-YUFE (Short-Term Exchange Program at Yamagata University Faculty of Engineering). Please be aware that this program is different from the Short-Term Exchange Program at Yamagata University (STEP-YU).

#### 3. STEP-YUFE Program Features and Aims

This program aims to give both undergraduate and graduate students of various countries an opportunity to improve their Japanese language ability and their understanding of Japan, as well as their academic studies and research. The program offers regular courses given in Japanese at the Faculty of Engineering. Enrollment is possible in the above mentioned faculties and graduate schools. Depending on the exchange agreement with the partner institution, enrollment may be limited to undergraduate students.

In order to participate in undergraduate courses held in Japanese together with Japanese students, undergraduate applicants must have a level of Japanese equivalent to at least level N2 of the Japan Foundation Japanese Language Proficiency Test (JLPT).

Graduate students are expected to have a level of Japanese high enough to adjust to everyday life in Japan even if they perform their research in English. Therefore, students with low proficiency in the Japanese language are strongly advised to participate in Japanese language training both prior to coming to Japan and while at Yamagata University. For the possibility of performing research in English, please ask us in advance.

#### The program runs from:

April 1, 2021 to either September 30, 2021, or March 31, 2022 October 1, 2021 to either March 31, 2022, or September 30, 2022

#### Necessary qualifications:

- 1) The applicant must be an undergraduate or graduate student enrolled in a university<sup>2</sup>. The applicant must be at least in his/her second year of undergraduate study at the time of application.\_
- 2) The applicant's desired field of study or research must be consistent with existing courses at this university.
- 3) The applicant must have Japanese or English ability adequate for smooth participation in university life.

#### Furthermore,

- Undergraduate students are required to take an English language test (TOEIC, TOEFL, IELTS, etc.) and the
  Japanese Language Proficiency Test. While not strictly required, it is preferable for students to obtain results
  of more than or equivalent to level N2 for the Japanese Language Proficiency Test.
- Graduate students are required to take either an English language test (TOEIC, TOEFL, IELTS, etc.) or the Japanese Language Proficiency Test. If your main communication language is in English, you are required to obtain a TOEIC score of at least 600 or TOEFL iBT score at least 6.1. If your main communication language is in Japanese, you are required to obtain a Japanese Language Proficiency Test result of more than or equivalent to level N2. It is desirable for students to take both of them.

We will not be able to take any students who have graduated from their home university or who will graduate from their home university during the period of their study at Yamagata.

#### 4. Content of Classes

Supplementary Courses in Japanese Language<sup>3</sup> (Yonezawa Campus):

The following courses are for the Fall Semester 2020. One lesson lasts 90 minutes.

In such an area, we guarantee that international students will have a great opportunity to fully enjoy their stay in Japan.



5. Life in Japan

#### Spring and Fall Semesters

The Spring Semester starts in early April and ends in early August. The summer vacation continues until September 30. The Fall Semester starts on October 1. There are approximately 15 days of New Year's vacation from the end of December to early January. After the end of the semester, there is another vacation from late February through March.

#### After Arriving in Japan

After arriving in Yamagata, students will be lodged at the International House. Within two or three days, students will be required to register their addresses, open bank accounts, take a Japanese language placement test, and participate in a campus tour and orientation. Students will also have to register for classes during the first week of the term. Each student will be assigned a Japanese student as a tutor to help them get used to life in Japan.

#### Housing and Cost of Living

For short-term international students at Yamagata University (at Yonezawa campus), students can be accommodated at the Yonezawa International House. Please be aware that you might be required to rent an apartment off-campus if the number of applicants for the International House is over the capacity. The residents of the International House are determined by the Yamagata University Faculty of Engineering International Exchange Center.

The Yonezawa International House is about a ten-minute walk from campus. In the single rooms, there will be a bed, desk, chair, air conditioner, mini kitchen, kitchen shelf, bookshelf, refrigerator, shower and toilet.

Please see the table below about the expenses regarding housing. Other than the expenses below, electricity, gas, and water will have to be paid. Internet is available as well, but an individual contract is necessary to use the Internet.

<sup>\*</sup>The security deposit will be used for cleaning the room, futon, and refrigerator and for other expenses (like damage or losses) upon moving out. The remaining sum will be returned to the student.

Students living in Yamagata will have to pay for their room rent, utilities, food, transportation, internet, phone, and after class activities. In total, this comes out to approximately \$60,000 per month (the current exchange rate<sup>4</sup> is \$105.79 JPY = 1 USD or \$125.46 JPY = 1 EUR).

#### 6. How to Apply: Deadlines

The selection of candidates for STEP-YUFE is carried out on based on an evaluation of each applicant's grade point average (GPA), his/her plan for study and research, and a letter of recommendation issued by his/her professors. Students applying for the program are asked to send their complete application materials to the address given on the back of this pamphlet by registered mail, through their home university's International Exchange Office (or the equivalent thereof) by the following deadlines: December 2, 2020 for students starting in April, 2021 and April 30, 2021 for students starting in October 2021.

In addition, if there is more than one applicant from a single university, we ask the office to please inform us in which order the applicants are recommended.

#### 7. Notification of Results

The results of the selection process will be sent to the International Exchange Office (or the equivalent thereof) of the applicant's home university by mid-March (for Spring semester applicants) or late August (for Fall semester applicants).

The Certificate of Eligibility necessary for obtaining a visa will be sent to the same office around the same time that we send out the results of the selection process. Before the arrival, applicants are asked to confirm the necessary procedures for attaining a visa with their local Japanese Embassy or Consulate. Applicants must also book and pay for their airplane tickets to Japan.

#### 8. Access to Yonezawa Campus

To get to Tokyo Station from Narita or Haneda Airport, please use the public train system (JR Narita Express or Keisei Skyliner for Narita Airport; Tokyo Monorail for Haneda Airport). To get from Tokyo to Yonezawa station, take the Yamagata Shinkansen (Tsubasa), which takes about 2 hours.
